The classrooms were decorated with a host of stuffed toys, dolls, puzzles, music and rhymes. The first few days had an array of fun filled events to enjoy.



The kindergarten section witnessed a gamut of events and exuberant activities which provided the children with good learning experience.



The pre-primary tots got themselves busy with activities like bubble wrap and vegetable printing, mosaic art, salt painting and making shapes using ice-cream sticks.

Primary Panorama



The new academic session kick started on a positive note and the bright and happy faces of our little ones said it all. Naughty chatter, happy laughter and faces full of anticipation and great expectation eagerly waited, wanting to know who their new teachers were, new classmates would be and above all where their new classroom would be. On settling down the young learners were all charged to face the new academic session with zest and vigour.

Every classroom was a creative learning centre, with attractive bulletin boards, displaying inter active charts.



Well, in a nutshell let us brief you about how our little children progressed each day with the guidance of their teachers and help from peer groups. Every day there was something new for each one and they excitedly took part in the process.



LAR meant placards and displays for the different word families, word wheels, word blends, models, role plays, project work, bunny walk, spotting noun words walking around the campus, Pictionary games, word games, crosswords, origami, adding adjectives to pictures and the endless list went on. Surely there's never been a dull moment in any of the classes.

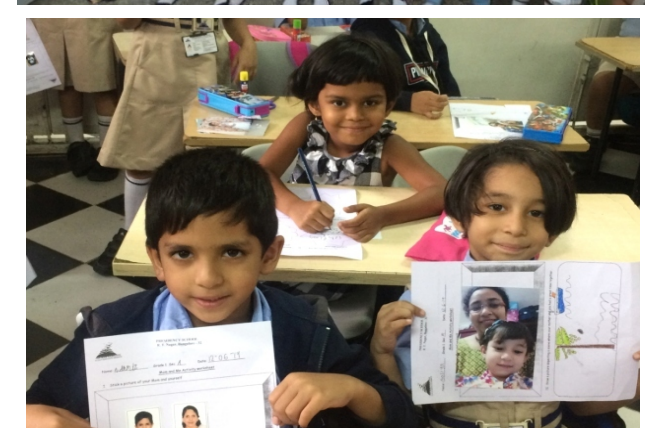
Math, a tricky and interesting subject is always taught through games, puzzles, tricksters and guessing games. Activities are conducted using number cards, picture cards, straw, ice-cream sticks, toys, abacus, place value charts, group activities and math stories based on multiplication and division. All these activities related to various topics helped students to understand and love math concepts in an interesting manner.

Science, another subject that interests most of our young learners are taught using a play-way method, conducting experiments and the 'do, observe and understand' method. Some of the activities conducted were making greeting cards for their friends, for their favourite festivals, Leaf printing, collages, fact files of endangered species of birds, project on feet and claws of birds, models of nests, structure of tooth, project on botanical gardens etc. Shape books were made showing the different kinds of food preservation. Through these activities our children were able to understand concepts better and retain them as well.

In Social Science our students worked on a project on different sources of history showing coins, seals, inscriptions and pottery of various periods in history. They also completed a project explaining private property. Projects and charts on the Solar System were made and exhibited in class. The students prepared a shape book on different community helpers showing how they are useful to the society.

In languages Kannada and Hindi, students learnt through activities, class discussions and writing activities, advertisements and letters. Besides these activities related to classroom teaching other activities were conducted on a monthly basis. It kick-started in the month of June which was christened the 'Science Month' while July was 'English Month' and August 'Social Science Month'. The teachers of each of these departments planned and executed various activities.

In the month of June, students created beautiful models and other useful articles like pen holders, photo frames, musical instruments, show pieces and artistic bags all out of waste material which were recycled and used. Thus children understood that all things need not be thrown away as waste but could be made into useful things thereby creating 'wealth out of waste'. They also worked out a proper 'Meal Planner' for a healthy living.





In the month of July, the students had an activity called 'Grammar Bags', 'a mixed bag' containing various parts of speech. Students worked in groups putting them into the right labelled boxes provided. The next activity 'tail catchers' were thoroughly enjoyed by students, where they made new words with the last letter of the word. First a three-letter word, then a four-letter word, so on and so forth. A handwriting competition was also held. All students participated enthusiastically in all the events thoroughly enjoying every bit of it. August the month, India got her freedom is a red lettered month for us. So it was activities related to Independence. To help students get a better awareness of their motherland a questionnaire was given to them. All our children wrote touching letters to our beloved soldiers and sang patriotic songs as part of the celebrations.



Celebrations are a part and parcel of our lives. In Presidency we celebrate every festival in a very big way. These celebrations are held during the morning special assemblies schedule. The academic year began with the Environment Day celebrations in June. The programme commenced with a talk on the importance and significance of the celebration and the need to save our Earth, as our Earth is facing perils of different kinds by way of pollution, global warming, cutting down trees, killing animals and humans acting against the forces of nature. Our young children were made to understand the need of the moment and do their bit to make a difference to the world they live in. Next, we had the Eid celebrations, the whole school celebrated together. Students understood the importance of the festival and why it is celebrated. It was heartening to see all taking in the essence of the festivity breaking all barriers.



In July, we had the 'Ocean Day' celebration. All students of the primary came in sea blue attire, wearing headgears and masks of different sea creatures. The whole school had the effect of the ocean. Students understood that they need to protect their water bodies too as they are the 'Lungs of our Planet'.



For the 'Varamahalakshmi' festival, the little ones of Grade I came in their traditional grandeur, they danced to the tunes of the classical song 'Ashtalakshmistotra'. The rituals and specialties of the festival were highlighted through a talk. The primary school students celebrated Independence Day with great fervour. Students were made aware of the great sacrifices of our freedom fighter and the price they had to pay for us to gain this freedom. Patriotic songs, dances and skits were portrayed on the occasion.



On the 23rd of August we celebrated Krishna Janmashtami. The birth and life of Lord Krishna was projected through speeches, songs and dances. Children got a better understanding about the birth and early life of Lord Krishna while on the 27th of August we celebrated Ganesh Chaturthi. Songs and dances made the celebration zestful.



On the 12th of September, the students of the primary school, celebrated 'Onam' - the harvest festival of Kerala. This festival is celebrated irrespective of caste, creed or religion. It's a time of love, brotherhood of all sections of people. 'Thiruvathira Kali', 'Chendamela' and the traditional 'Vallamkali' were all staged on the occasion.



Onam celebration was followed by Dussehra celebrations. Children learnt that this celebration symbolizes the victory of good over evil and that India is a land that celebrates numerous festivals together. Celebrating all these festivals at school, helped our young children to savour the spirit of oneness and unity, love and respect for all.

The last celebration for the session was when we celebrated Hindi Divas on the 13th of September. The theme chosen was 'cleanliness'. Students enacted a skit on the theme and concluded the celebration with a dance.



Our students enjoyed outings, all classes of the primary have gone out on field trips. Some places they visited were the museum, botanical gardens, Unibic Biscuit factory and the UAS Campus. Through these field trips children got a first-hand account of how things are done, how things work and the various stages of production.



The club activities are underway and brimming with enthusiasm. Some of the clubs in action are math club, science club, art club, music club, French club, chess and sports club apart from cubs, bulbul, scouts, guides, NCC.

Value based movies were also screened in the classroom as scheduled. Students know that no matter what, it is their priority to inculcate good habits and human values first. Being a good child, being kind, polite, honest, patient and sympathetic are values that need to be built up at early stages of childhood. What we build early lasts for a lifetime. What we do today will make our tomorrow.

Circle Time is also a part of our curriculum. During Circle Time each student is able to share his/her feelings, doubts, fears and happiness to the class and teacher. This Circle Time helps us as teachers to understand the child better and try our best to help them. Cultural activities were also held from time to time, where children shared displayed culture, tradition, dress, language and food habits of the state they hail from.

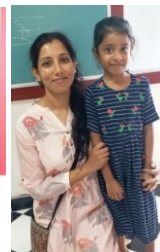

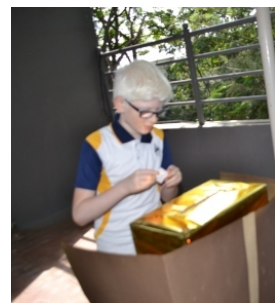
