

At Presidency, the culture that has been deeply rooted is respect for one another and that begins from home.



We also paid rich tributes to all parents and grandparents back home who were in this noble profession as well!














Field trip-Sun and Sand-here we come!



Science Activities and Competitions

A competition titled 'Facemistry' was also held. There was a lot of enthusiasm and eagerness in students to participate in the competition. Students were to paint a face either their face or anyone else, or the face of a doll to bring forth a term from the World of Chemistry.

GRADE 8

- 1. Students participated in the 'Kahoot Quiz' competition which was based on 'General facts of Science'. The quiz consisted of 30 questions with a time limit to stick by.
- 2. A physics activity was conducted in grade 8 on 'Application of Physics in daily life'. Students made models of fans, reflection of light (mirror) using concave and convex mirror, evaporation of liquids etc.
















GRADE 9








English Department Activities



















GRADE 6

1. "Writing is the painting of the voice!" - Voltaire Creative Writing expresses the writer's thoughts and feelings in an imaginative way. Students of Class 6 participated in creative writing activity. Students gave expression to their creative ideas and penned them down in the form of beautiful paragraphs and essays. The activity provided an opportunity to improve their spellings, increase their vocabulary and hone their creative skills.

2.Spell Bee was organised for grade 6
In this age of auto- correct and spell check, the Spell Bee activity for Grade 6 came as a whiff of fresh breeze. An activity on Spell Bee was conducted for the students of Class 6 on 2nd July, 2020 Students participated with great enthusiasm and dueled through some tough words to prove their mettle. They were to find the missing letters in the words. Clues were provided to look for the correct words. Pictures of vegetables, flowers and animals were also shown to the students to identify and write the words with correct spellings. The activity made the students aware of the spellings and also enriched their vocabulary. It was a wonderful learning experience for the participants.


3. Elocution refers to one's capacity of communicating with others, with the use of exact speech and gestures. An Elocution Competition for Grade 6 was conducted. Students earnestly participated in the competition. A preliminary round for the same was conducted and seventeen students qualified for the finals. It was indeed astounding to see how students presented their poems and speeches with great enthusiasm and vigor.

The themes for the competition were 'Wellness', 'Compassion' and 'Happiness'.









GRADE 7

1.Two activities 'Grammar quiz' and 'Fact File' were organised for students of grade 7

2. The students of Grade 7 participated in the Elocution Competition. The theme was 'humour' which is much needed in the current day scenario. Students recited pieces of poetry and prose. Their renditions were amusing, humorous and gave the audience a much-needed comical break.

GRADE 8

1.Students of 8ABCD took part in the Poetry Writing Activity on the topic Racial, Gender and Religious Discrimination. Students actively participated in the activity and came out with thought filled poetry. Each student chose a topic of interest and produced extraordinary work. Overall, it was a creative platform where every student got a chance to present him/her poetry to others.

2.Grammar quiz. Students of 8ABCD participated in a Grammar Quiz as a part of English Activity on 9th July, 2020. 56 students participated. The Grammar Quiz comprised various grammar concepts which helped them to brainstorm and quickly apply the concept in the given time frame (20-30 seconds). The concepts covered in the quiz were Prepositions, Sentence Types, Transformation of Sentences, Synonyms and Antonyms. The quiz had a nail-biting finish, with a very healthy competition amongst the students.

3.Students of 8ABCD took part in Declamation Competition. Fourteen students competed and were judged on skills such as expression, modulation, oration and most importantly originality in delivery! The students did not mimic the original author of the speech. Instead, they developed an oration that delivered the message of the author in an original and engaging manner.

GRADE 9

1.Students of GRADE 9 participated in poetry writing as part of English Activity. Thirty-three budding poets, logged into 9 ABCD General Channel to showcase their poetic talents. Relevance of the topic is significant in the present scenario of northern border incursions.

The participants came up with some beautiful lines:

'We go to war to protect peace', 'War is nothing but merciless blood shed' 'Peace is harmony in the absence of violence', 'Destruction is War, Construction is Peace'

'Do we fight wars for peace, or is peace broken by wars?'

The students were enthusiastic about this activity, some of their works were beautifully illustrated.


- 2.Grade 9 students also participated in a Slogan writing competition

GRADE 6


A competition on Rakhi making was conducted for the students of Grade 6. The event had a prelude with introductions and a session on , the values and history of rakhi making. 
GRADE 7




An activity on Model making- WINDMILL was conducted for the students of Grade 7 on 4th August, 2020. Students made working models of a Windmill.


The students during their presentation spoke of the windmill as a structure that converts wind power into energy. Some of them brought out the reference of the journey of windmills through the early days.



Primary Panorama

The academic year 2020 2021 started with unanswered questions, apprehensions and uncertainty for the entire human race. Quick positive decisions were taken by the School Management, training teachers to use technology and providing new tools for teaching and learning online soon became second skin. It did not take long for teachers and students to adapt to this new way of virtual learning. We were all in it together. We were venturing into pastures unknown, yet it was a great going for all of us. Nothing could hold us back and together the Presidency family forged ahead breaking the barriers of the lockdown and took school into the individual homes of our children, where they were safe...but learning never stopped. Classes started off full swing for all grades. Virtual learning became the buzz word for success. All students attended their classes as if it were a regular classroom. In Social Studies, children learnt many new topics through presentations and projects.


