

Another academic year dawned. The cloud of uncertainty, fears, concerns loomed large! Concerns of safety, of learning gaps due to virtual schooling, missing social interaction and many such!

Well, we at Presidency were prepared to take on all challenges and concerns with an assurance to address and resolve! Teachers underwent rigorous training sessions where by they were updated with all latest classroom teaching skills, technological upgradation and emotional well-being!

And lo! the school year kick started with excitement and jubilation. Classroom teaching, extra-curricular activities, competitions, dance, music, art, yoga, PT, everything they always loved, were offered to them from the safety of their homes. It did bring about a lot of excitement to them. Yes, they learnt everything and more, as we took school to the homes of our children.

Classes started in full swing, for our primary children and no stone was left unturned while offering, nothing but the best to our young learners. Let me begin by giving you a gist of the learning and the excitement.









details of all the four skills – listening, speaking, reading and writing. Each of these lessons had activities which ensured complete learning. Knowing the importance of phonics, a tried and tested method, sight words and high frequency words were learnt through phonic patterns. Spelling right was made easy! Grammar topics were taught in the concentric circles of difficulty. The use of PowerPoint presentations, flash cards and videos helped in reinforcing the concepts better. Poetry writing, spotting parts of speech, role plays and the representation of various characters from their prescribed novels added vigour to learning. Grammar games like 'Name-Place-Animal-Thing', 'Picking Pronouns', 'Swatting the fly' were played in the classroom with great zeal. Children were delighted to watch the antics of Rabbit Hop, Caucus Race, Lullaby, Harry Potter, Charlotte's Web and the BFG. The students of Grade 5 enjoyed working in groups in the Breakout Rooms! This gave them an opportunity to collaborate, work in smaller groups and present their point of view.

LAR had every lesson taught keeping in mind

In the learning of languages like **Kannada** and **Hindi** Power Point presentations, **Quiziz**, **Kahoot** and hands on activities had students asking for more! Short stories were screened for students to view in the classroom. This surely developed listening and speaking skills. Individual reading sessions were also conducted. This enabled children to develop their skills in both languages. Model reading and recitation videos were shared with students to help them pronounce accurately. Students in turn replicated the same and shared the video for assessment.

The Math class is always a lively place to be in. children are super excited to learn and develop new mathematical skills through exciting games and fun filled activities. Math games like 'Snakes and Ladders', 'Playing with Numbers', 'Creating Abacus' and singing math related songs added to the exhilaration in the classroom. Songs related to geometrical patterns helped students enjoy their learning and at the same time, understand the concepts well. In **Science**, our children learnt concepts through experiments, observations and recording their findings. Virtual Science labs thrilled the students!

Students used simple materials that were available at home to create models and projects that enhanced their learning, to name just a few, 'Food Pyramids', 'Habitats', claws and teeth of birds, nests, life cycles and pictorial charts! Catchy posters were created by children which spoke of saving and conserving water and soil.

Social Studies comprised conceptual presentations and detailed project work that required research to be content rich and accurate. The young learners created attractive family trees that helped them understand the roots of their families and relationships. Project Based Learning was further given ground with research on sources of history, the solar system, the four domains of the earth, national symbols and leaders, elections etc were presented by our children. Beautiful drawings and pencil shading work showcasing the stone and iron tools of the Early man saw the creative master strokes by our bubbly lot!

In the **Art classes**, children explored sceneries, drawings using varied colour schemes and techniques like painting, sketching and pencil shading. They also had a tryst with origami and paper craft activities that kept them engaged!













The dance and music classes had them learning new steps, new genres and new strings of music. It was fun watching them sing together from the corners of their homes. What if the lag tried to play, havoc!

The **Yoga and PT** classes added that extra bit of exercise that all of them needed to rejuvenate their mind and body.

The HRP sessions, class assemblies and special assemblies commemorating various festivals and celebrations never failed to enthuse our students and parents! It was a successful, eventful and promising session for all connected to the Presidency Family at RT Nagar.





















Celebrations




Founders Day


Krishna Janmashtami

English Department Activities and


