Wishing you happiness and well being always.

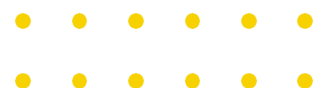

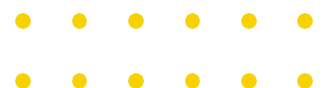
Parent Orientation

'Best out of waste' and 'Cooking without Fire' offered the parents a platform to showcase their creative skills, Moms and Dads respectively.

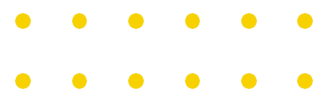

HINDI DIWAS

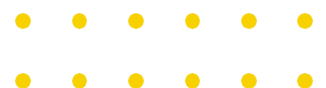
The students and staff of **PRESIDENCY SCHOOL, R. T. NAGAR**, celebrated Hindi Diwas with great zeal at School.

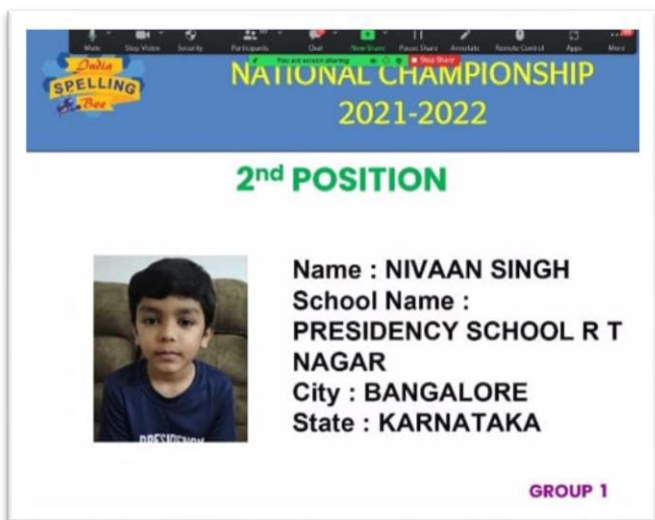

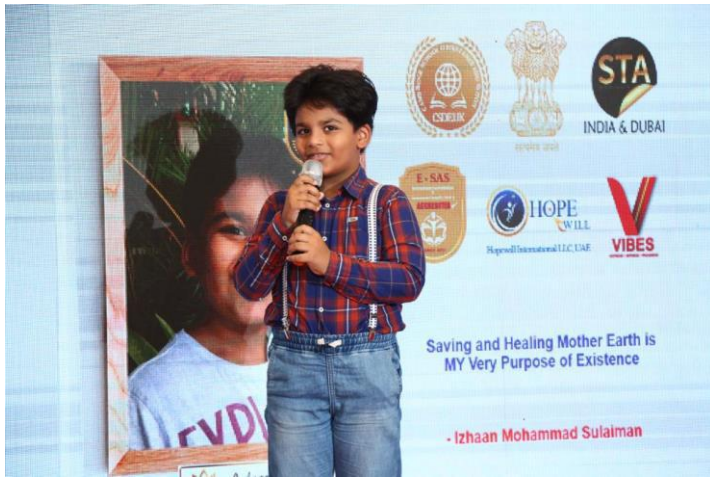

Open Chess Tournament

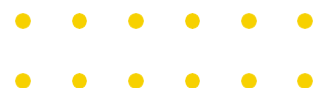

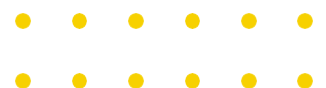
KISA Swimming

MUN Achievement

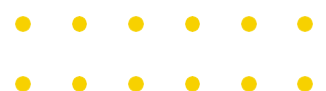
The young Munnors of Presidency School RT Nagar were awarded the Best Delegation at the Bishop Cotton Girls Model Parliament.

The energetic Team comprised Aniruddh, Kethana, Afifa, Dhrithi and Ridhvira who left behind an inedible mark and brought home the trophy.





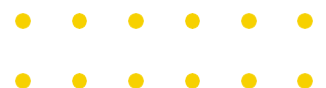

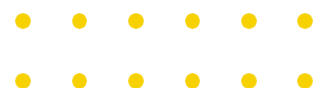

Krishna Janmashtami - 19.8.22

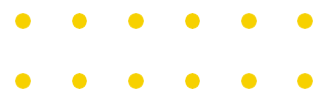

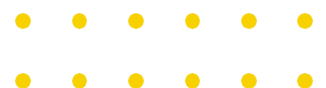

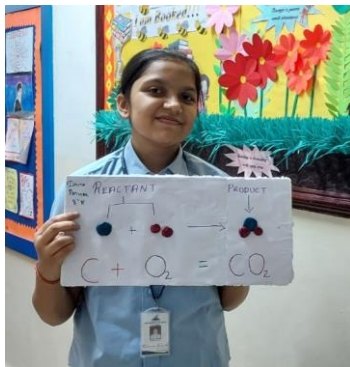


Science Activities and Competitions

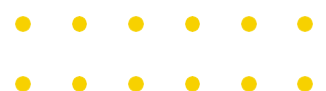




English Department Activities and Competitions

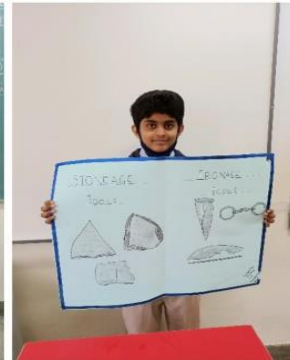
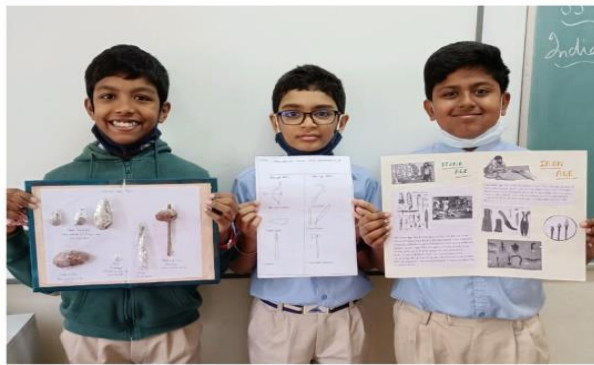


Social Science Department Activities and Competitions

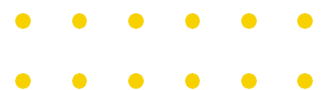
