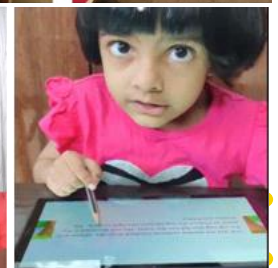
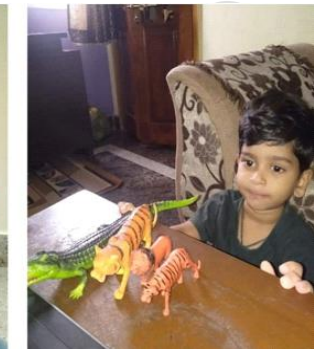
WHAT'S ON AT THE KINDERGARTEN?

A Journey Towards Excellence

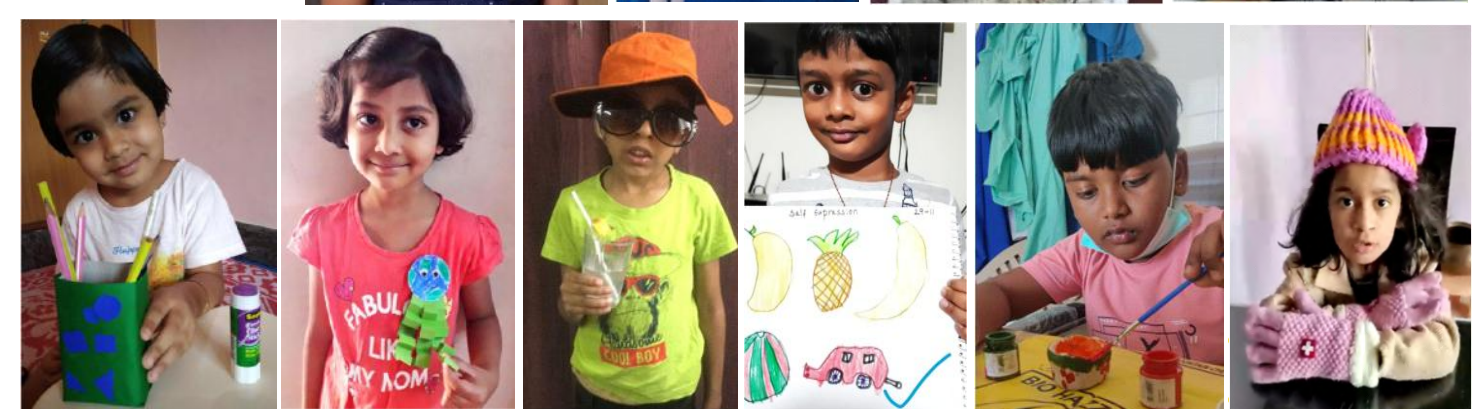
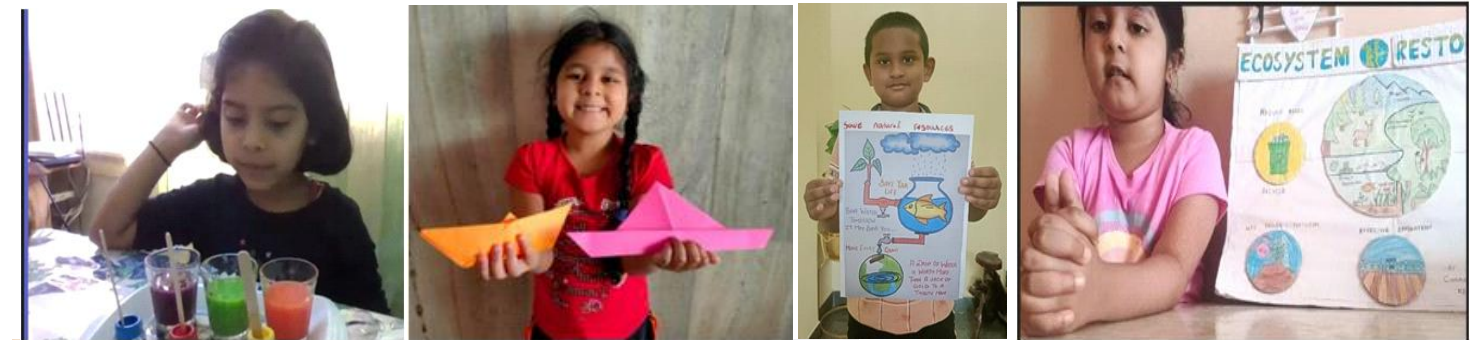

The Primary Panorama

The second semester of the academic year 2021-2022 began well, as we continued with our online classes for all grades. Our children were back with a bang after a short break ready to sing a new tune of yet another session! They were as eager and enthusiastic as their teachers. Yet, we could see that they were not so happy that normal school had not started as they expected. By February announcements were made for opening schools, and the children were more than excited to come back to school. The attendance in each class was encouraging as parents confidently sent their wards for offline classes after a gap of almost 2 years. The students of Grade 1-5 as always, settled down quickly and started studies in all earnestness.

In LAR, students had role plays, story writing, limerick writing, word building, story maps, recitation, representation of characters, fact files on authors and poets. They played a few grammar games too. Reading sessions and class discussions were part and parcel of everyday learning. Reading Programmes were also conducted at regular intervals. In languages like Kannada and Hindi students indulged in activities. Teachers related stories, that helped our young learners improve their listening and speaking skills. Spell checks were conducted in every class with just five words in all subjects. This helped children to improve in their spelling.

Our budding mathematicians love the subject and they are ever ready to participate in all activities related to mathematics. Models and projects were made on topics like counting, addition and subtraction. They worked on projects displaying fractions, representation of data and handling money. All this and more, helped our learners to focus on getting their concepts right. Colour coding for shapes, spotting various shapes in rooms, 2D shapes and bar graphs were all part of their learning.





In science, our students learnt every topic through experiments, activities and hands on learning. Moving on the bar of learning students went on being detectives by conducting investigations, observations and recording their findings. They also fixed bones and organs in the skeletal system.

Social Studies interests most students as they relate them to every topic they learn. The Universe, the Earth, Space and galaxies are topics that interest all of them. Models and projects like globes, chemical factories, water bodies, rock art, temples, terrace farming, crops, dams were displayed by our students. Both students and teachers stopped at nothing.

The HRP sessions were really thought provoking, many of our parents shared that tried their best to attend these sessions online which was a platform to build in values in our children. It motivated them too!

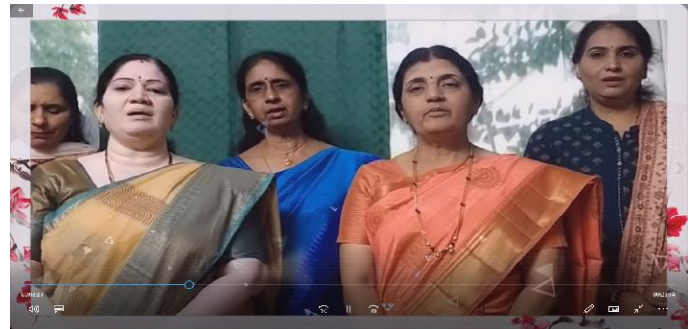
Children's Day

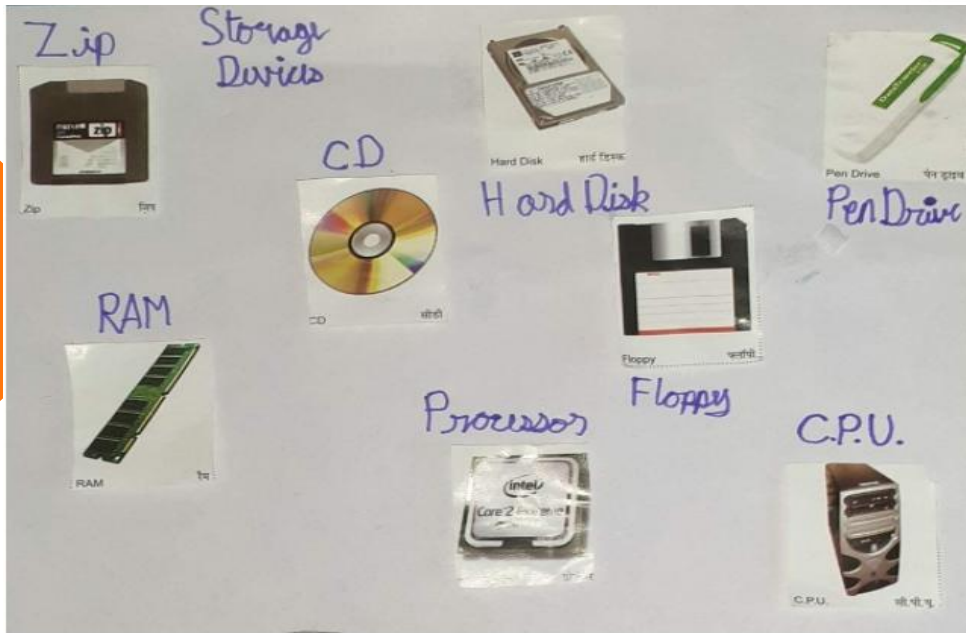




Computer Activities and Competition

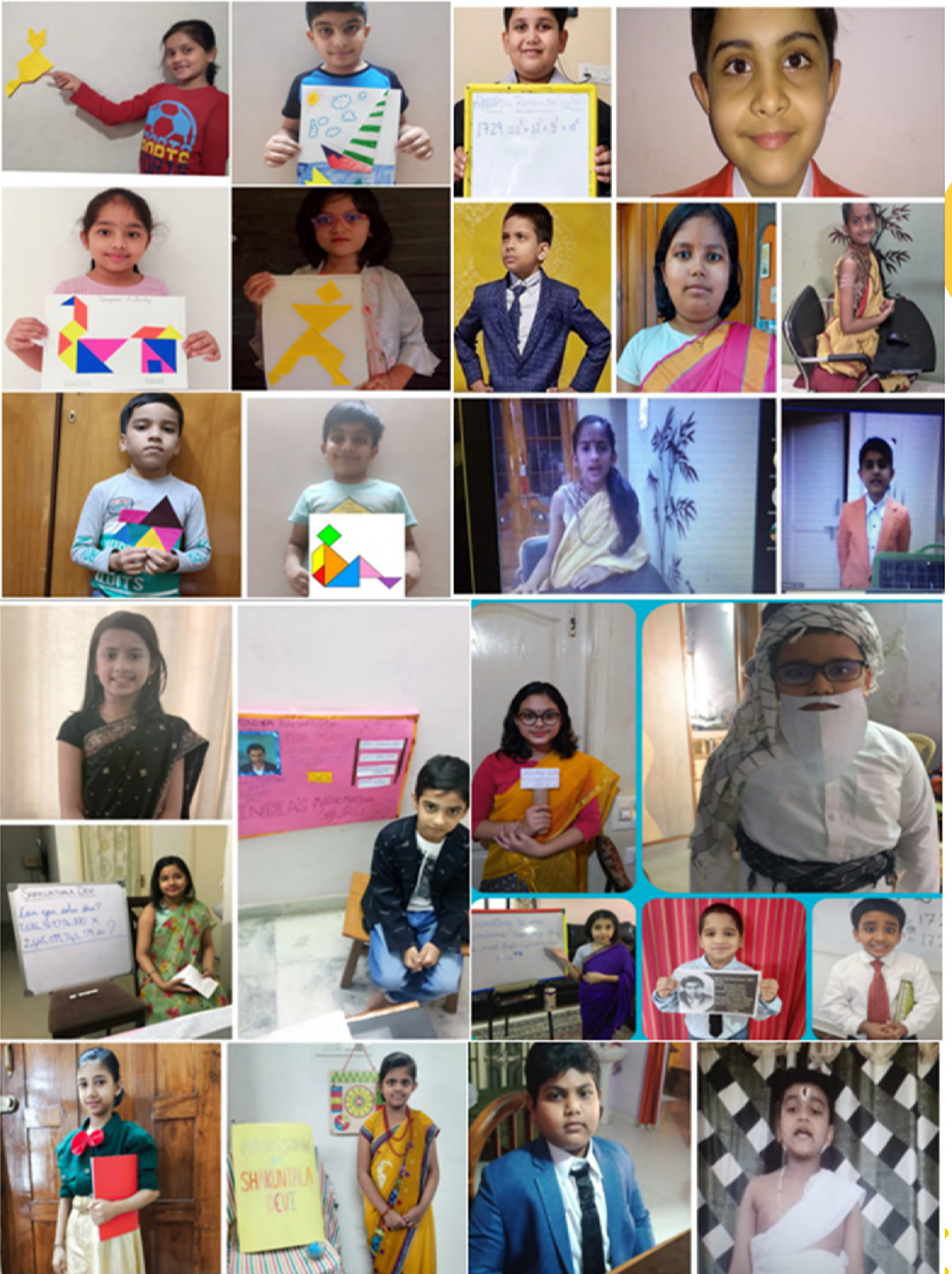


Math Activities and Competition

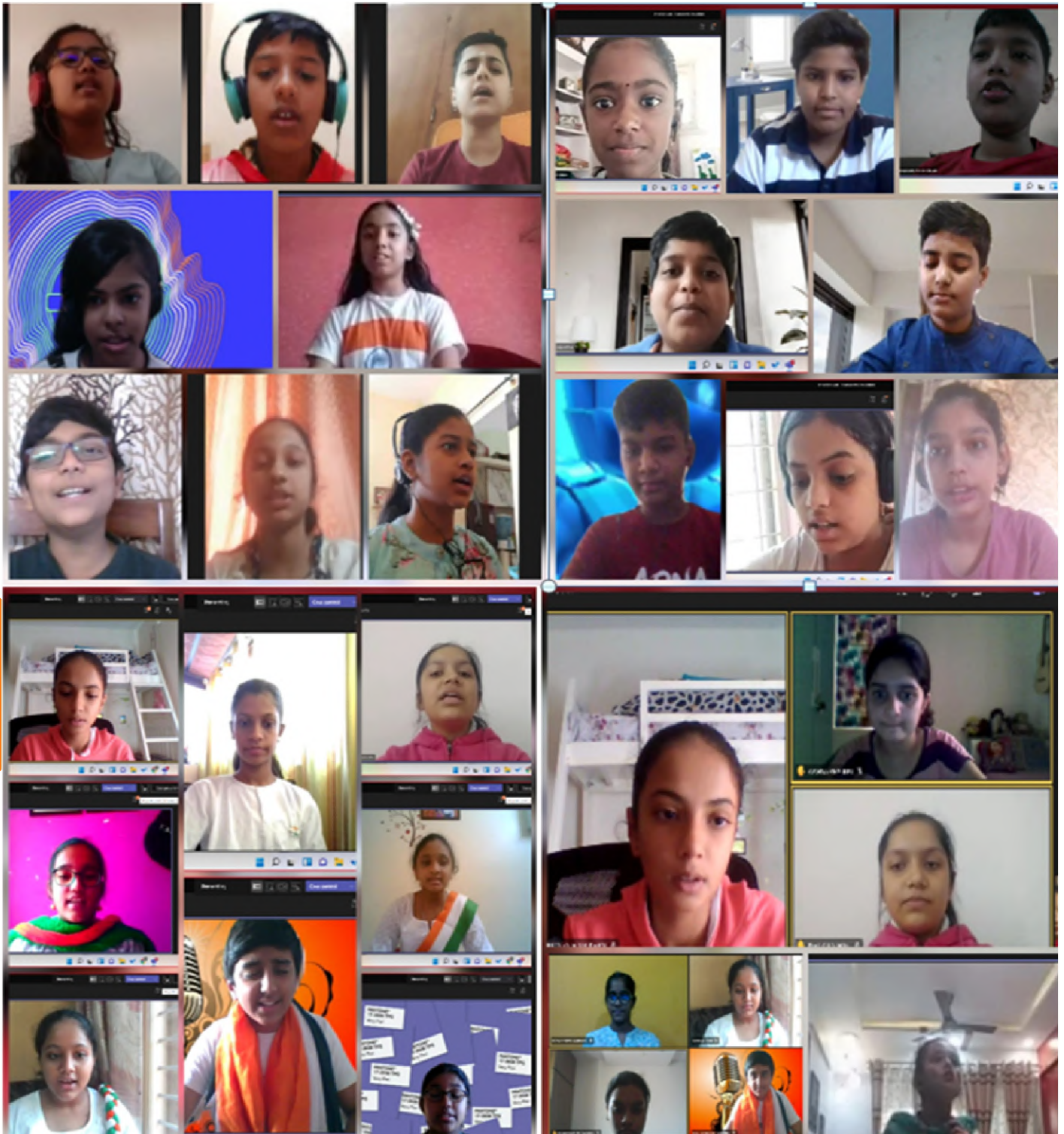






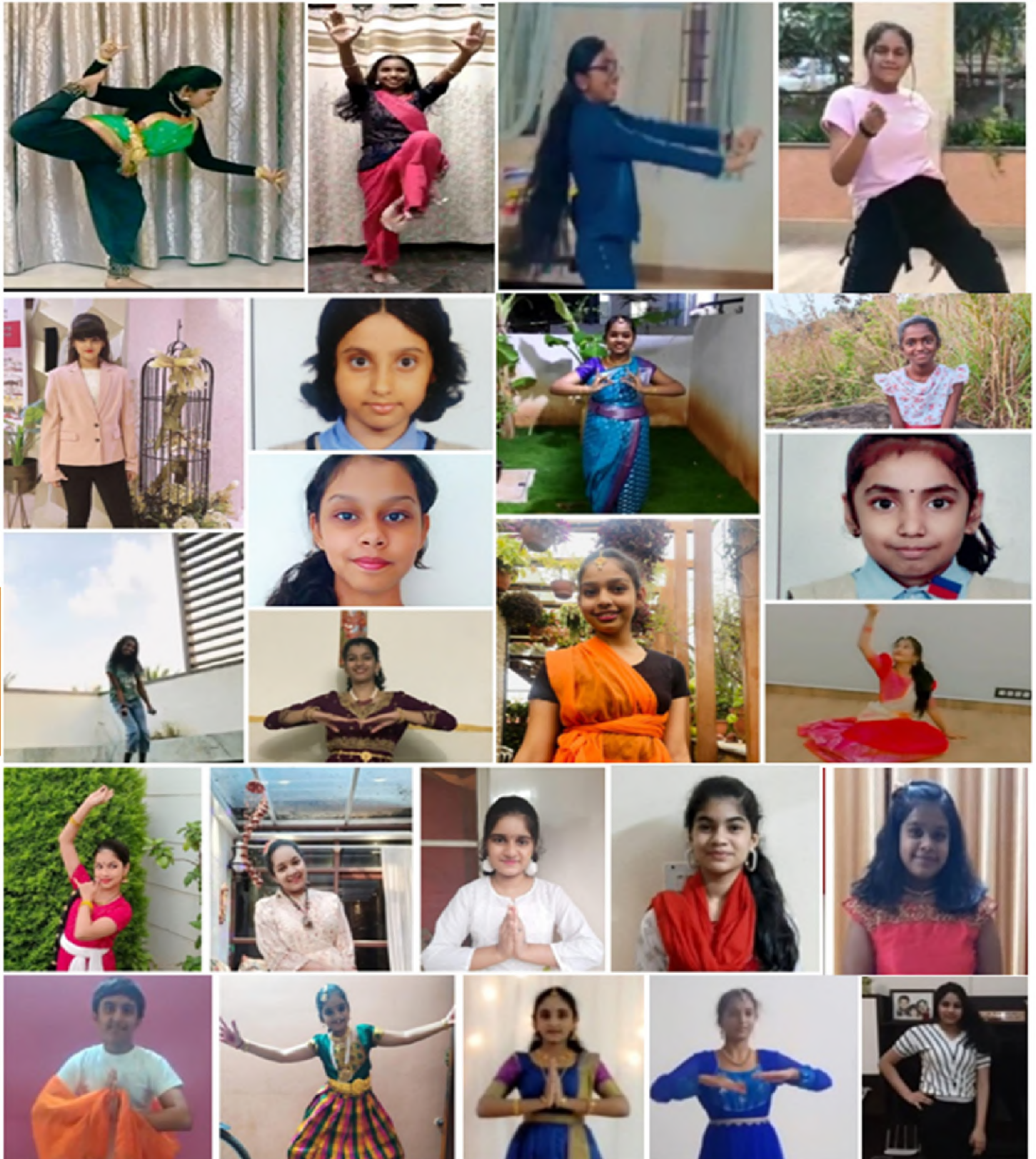
Music Activities and Competitions
