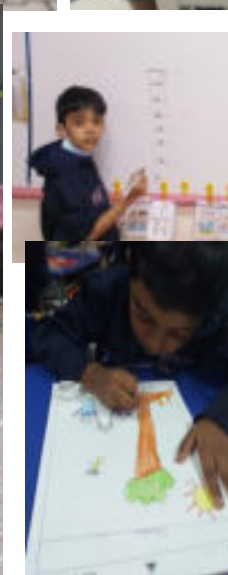
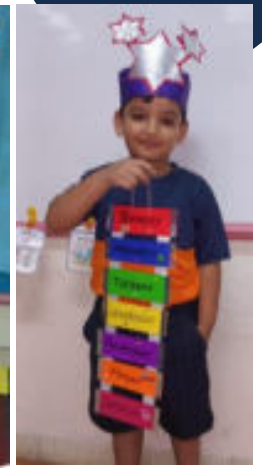
What's on at the Kindergarten?

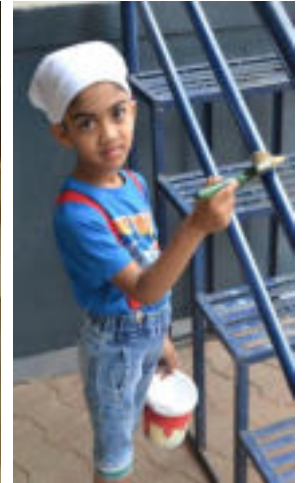
"Children are like tiny flowers; they are varied and need care, but each is beautiful alone and glorious when seen in the community of peers. "

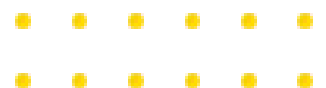


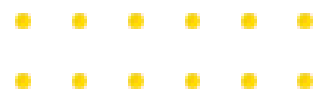


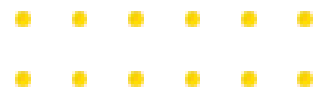
Kindergarten Graduation Ceremony –Euphoria

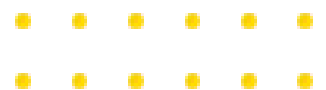

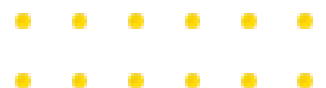


KISA Swimming

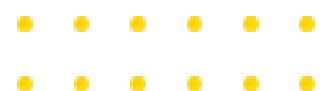


KISA Achievement

And we are the National Champions!

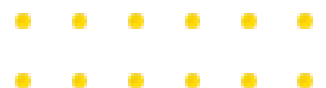

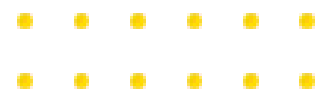
TCS 3rd Place

Kerala Samajam Karnataka Youth Festival

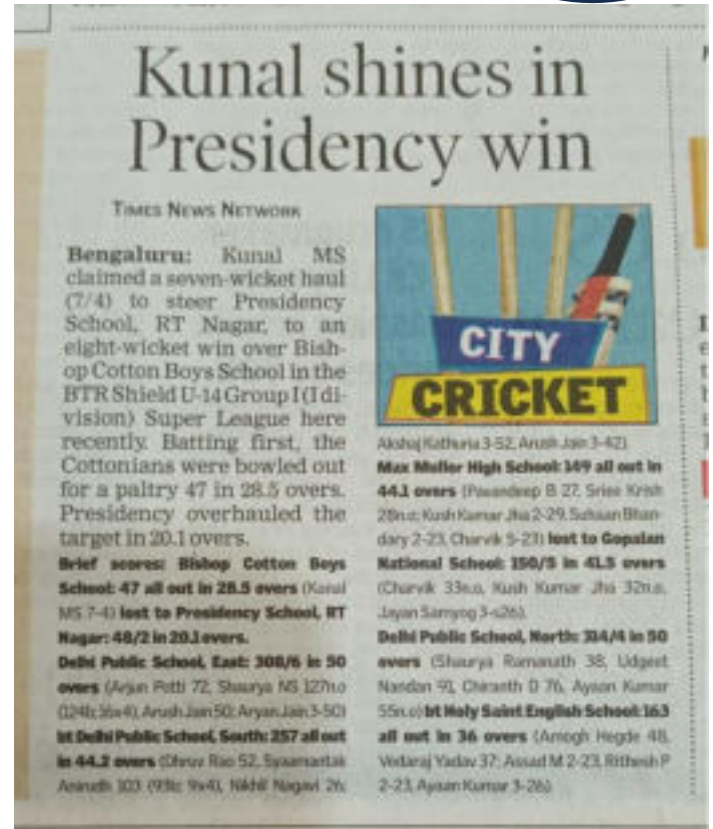

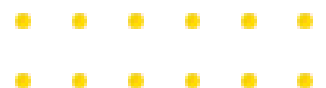
Valmiki Jayanthi

Make Mental Health and Well-being for all a global

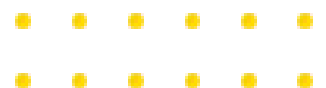

After all, Happiness can be found even in the darkest of times, if one only remembers to turn on the light!



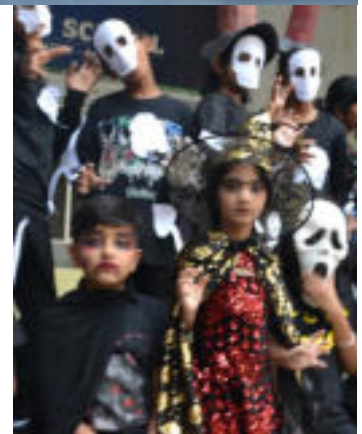
Halloweens Special Celebration Assembly

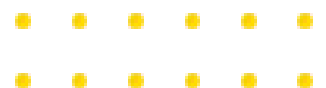


Varalakshmi Vratha

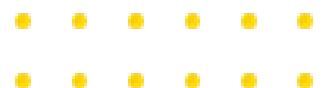
Doing our bit! Safety first!

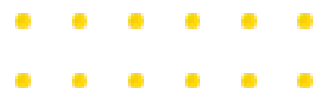
When the Post Office Comes to School..... **Drop a Letter!**

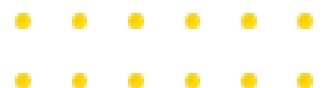
There was a sense of responsibility that was passed on as the cadets planted the hope for the future. True to the theme- Catch the Rain, we are sure that this initiative will reach fruition.



33rd Annual Sports Meet Pratispardha - 13th January, 2023

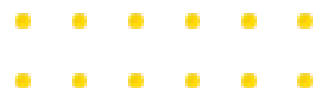

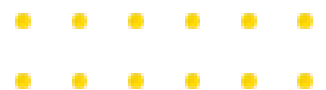
Children's Day

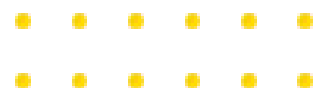


Spreading Cheer- the Presidency way

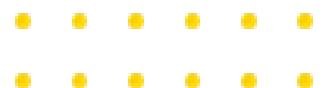
Republic Day Celebrations: Utkarsh Bharat

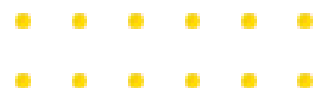

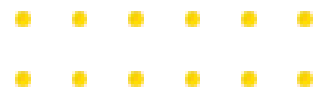




Exhibition - Jhalak 2022

Number Games

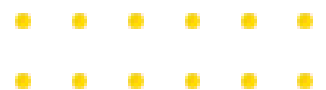

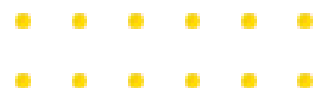
Department wise Activities

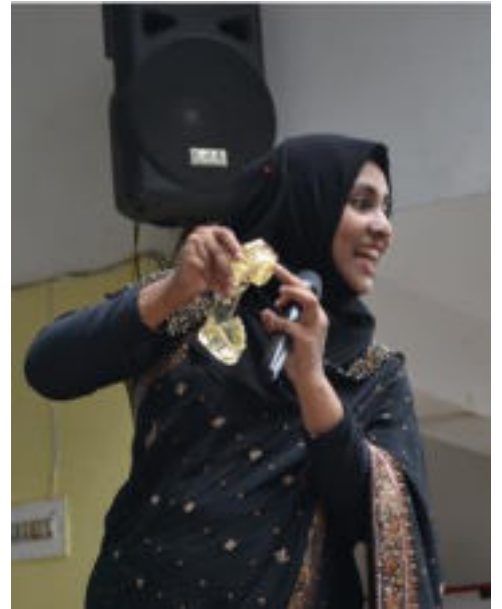

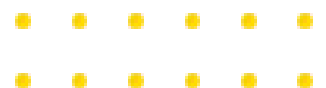
