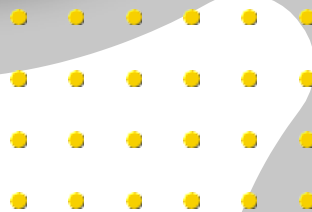

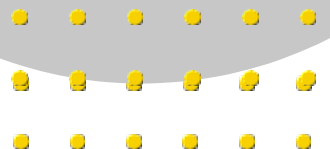

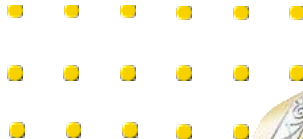

Fun days with colours.



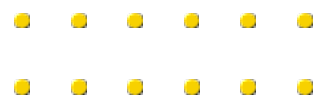

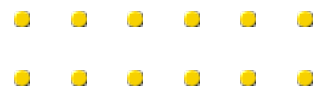


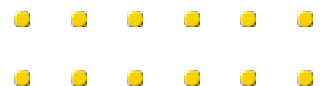


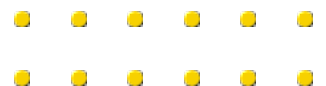
A symphony of events

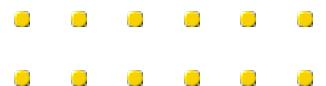

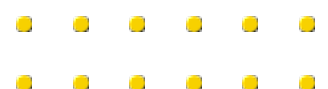






Puppet Show

Our Striped Heroes – Save Our Nation’s Pride

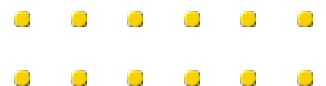

5th June, 2023

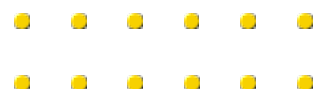

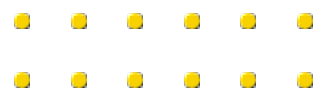




Science Month Activities Culmination

Cabinet Elections

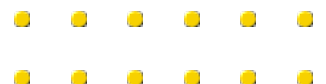

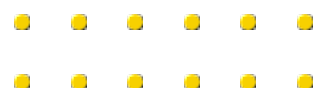

This was followed by lunch, after which the students were allowed to look around at displays of village scenes and engage in a few rides.

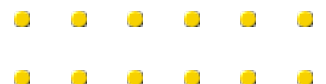
The field trip was an engaging and educational adventure and highly informative.

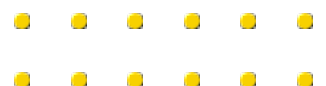

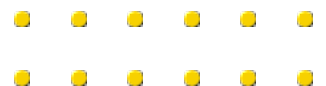
HINDI DIWAS 2023

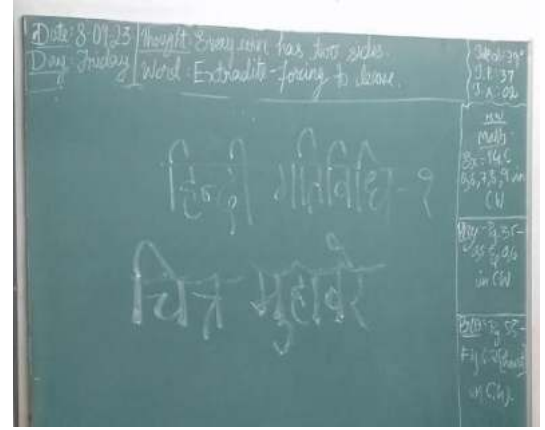

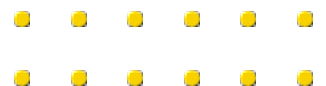




The month of August was marked as 'Social Studies Month' in the school calendar. A series of activities and competitions were conducted across grades. Students took part in all the activities enthusiastically

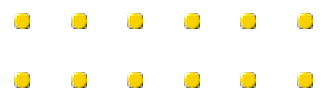
World Chocolate Day

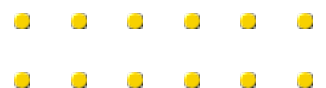
It indeed was a Herculean task for the judges to sieve out the best from the best. All our enthusiasts were winners and the certificates said it all!

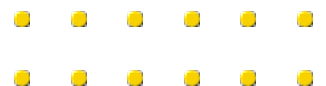

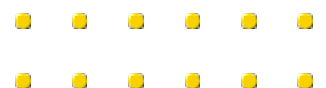




Special Assemblies

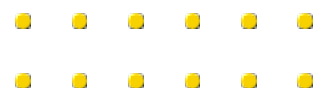
EID- AL-Adha Mubarak

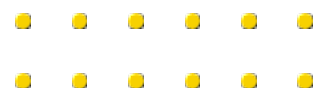


Onashamsakal- Harvest festival

Varamahalakshmi Special Assembly – Senior School

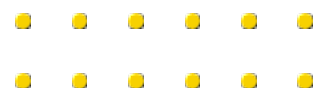

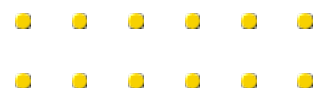
GOWRI –GANESHA – FESTIVITIES GALORE!

Dasara - When Goodness Calls- it's a recipe for triumph over evil!

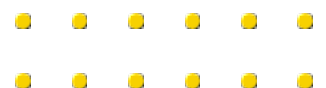

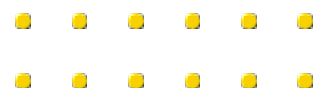
School House Wise Assemblies

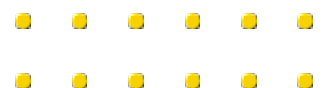


ITS RAINING AWARDS IN THE WORLD OF EDUCATION!

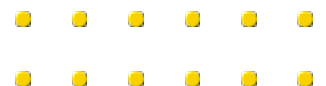








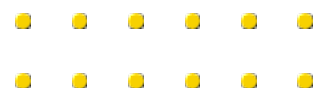


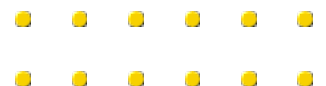


Excerpts from the Primary School

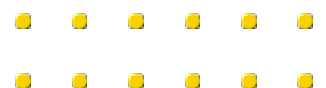
The forthcoming annual sports meet was flagged off by students pushing beyond their limits to make it to the finals.
