Classroom Scoop



LAR: The concept of singular/ plural was reinforced with an extended activity. The students learnt this through demonstrating, analysing and classifying the nouns which they executed to perfection.

SST: Students learnt 'Our Planet Earth'. Marking and labelling the seven continents and five oceans on an outline map of the world had them in rapt attention. This goes a long way in understanding the diversity that we live in and also the geology of the Earth.

MATH: Students used place value blocks to present the concept of units, tens, hundreds, thousand place. They represented the place and face value of the given number. The odd and even numbers were well depicted using ice cream sticks.

These are the stepping stones to identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line.

SCIENCE: Students learn to distinguish between living and non-living things based on characteristics such as growth, reproduction, and response to the environment, which are exhibited by living things but not by non-living things. They will classify objects and organisms, explain their categories, and explore the basic needs of living things and how these needs are met in various environments.

29/05/2024 and 8/06/2024: Parent Orientation session: Parents were inducted into the policies, HRP sessions, Timetable schedule, school timings, expected writing skills, bridging of learning gaps, Unit assessment pattern, etc. The Open forum set a platform to clarify doubts and get to know the system and processes better.

14/06/2024: Science activity: Planet Parade

Students engaged in a fun and educational "Planet Parade" activity, creating models of planets using various materials like styrofoam, paint, and clay. They presented their planets to the class, discussing their position in the solar system, size, composition, and interesting facts. The activity was a success, combining creativity with scientific learning and boosting students' confidence in public speaking.

21/06/2024: Science Competition: Coco Art -Students participated in a science competition where they used coconut shells as planters for different plants. Each planter was creatively decorated, showcasing the students' artistic talents and understanding of plant biology. The competition was a great success, encouraging environmental awareness, creativity, and a han ds-on approach to learning about plants.










Special Assembly

Parent Support

Dear Parents,

Parenting Your School-Age Child

What You Can Do

Model the behavior you want to see. Your children are watching and learning from you. Meet your responsibilities, follow house rules, and communicate with respect.

- Make a few important rules and enforce them every time. Remember, children want freedom, so give them choices in smaller matters (e.g., clothing, room decorations).
- Talk to children about what you expect. Post rules and routines where everyone can see them. Fewer "grey areas" mean less to argue about.
- Support their growing bodies. Children this age still need nutritious meals (especially breakfast) and 10 hours of sleep each night.
- Limit time spent watching TV, playing video games, or using the computer. Monitor Internet use for safety, and encourage your children to participate in hobbies and sports.
- Be involved with your children's school. Talk to their teachers and attend parents' night and school conferences. Show that school is important to you by providing a quiet space for homework, volunteering in your child's school, and celebrating your child's hard work.
- Offer support and understanding when your child has problems with peers. Explore ways to resolve conflicts, but do not interfere. If your child is being bullied at school, alert school staff and work with them to keep your child safe.
- Don't wait for your children to learn from peers. Educate yourself and talk to your children about your values. Help them practice ways to resist peer pressure.

Remember: Talk to your children, and listen to what they have to say. School age children may sometimes act like they don't care what their parents say, but they still want your love, attention, and guidance!
