

Punctuation Marks - Introducing punctuation marks to grade 1 students was fun and an engaging experience. Punctuation marks are special symbols we use to help us read and write clearly. They tell us when to stop, start, or pause when reading. Learning punctuation marks was an adventure! Students were introduced to punctuation marks - Full stop, Comma and Question Mark, using stick puppets. Children loved and enjoyed when these punctuation marks could talk and explain their attributes like - A full stop is like a big hug at the end of a sentence. It says, "This is the end." A comma is like a little breath between words. It helps us separate words in a list. And a question mark is like a curious face. It asks, "What's next?"

Shapes - The students of grade 1 were introduced to shapes where they used real-life everyday objects like paper, books, bangles etc to introduce basic 2D shapes like squares, rectangles, circles, and triangles. For 3D shapes objects like - ball, dice, chocolate boxes, water bottles, party caps etc were explored in class. The students could see and differentiate between 2D and 3D shapes. They could explain the number of sides, number of corners and number of faces of every shape. They were able to experience that which shape could roll and which shape could slide.

My House - The students learnt about My House in the month of August in which they had to make a booklet on the various kinds of houses seen in their surroundings. Students made very colourful booklets and stuck images of indpendent houses, kutcha houses, apartments, bunglows etc. Students were made to focus on key concepts, and used many oral quiz materials for quick recall during revisions in the month of September.









Structured Revision were conducted to prepare students of grade 1 for their upcoming assessment. These structured revision classes focused on reviewing key concepts and skills in LAR, Math, EVS, Hindi and Kannada . Teachers provided additional support and practice exercises to help students reinforce their understanding and build confidence. Through interactive activities and group work, students revised and refined their knowledge, addressing any areas of difficulty. With the revision classes, students were well prepared and eager to showcase their learning during the assessment. Teachers were able to identify areas where extra support was needed and remediated the same.


Movie Review

Special Assembly






