Early Numeracy



Recap of numbers 1 to 5

Early Numeracy helps children to develop a strong foundation in math skills. Children also learn to associate quantities with numbers. Recap of numbers 1 to 5 enabled students to write the numbers in sequence. Pre- number concept of tall and short helped children to differentiate the tall and short objects. Shape rectangle was introduced, which enabled them to identify various rectangular objects around them.
