World Environment Day





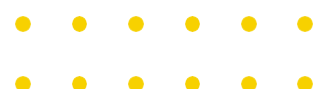

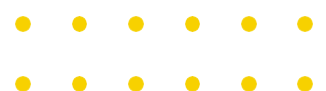




Anti-addiction Campaign by Mr. Bobby Chakraborty -Grades 8 to 10

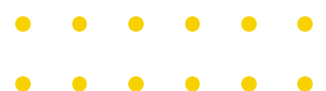


School Exhibition

SCIENCE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES AND COMPETITIONS-

Grade 6 - Students were able to visualize and create a presentation of selected topic and shared the knowledge. Topic: Motion and its types/ Simple machines/Energy. It allowed children to be creative and learn about physics concepts along with videos, models and hands on activities.

Grade 7 - Crossword puzzle – **“Elements our Friends”**. The purpose of this puzzle was to encourage students to understand more about the elements through clues which lead to the answers. Crossword puzzle provided students with an opportunity to think critically, collaborate, compete, and discuss salient concepts by using essential vocabulary associated with elements learnt. Our young learners actively participated and enjoyed solving the puzzle.

Grade 8 - Help me grow - Students brought small potted plants from home and added tap water, salt water and soda water to their plants. Students observed the plants for three days. Our young learners understood that only tap water was helping the plants to grow in a proper manner.

Grade 6 - World Environment Day - Best Out of Waste- Making Cloth Bag. The students participated in a creative and environmentally conscious cloth bag-making activity, where they transformed old clothes into stylish and functional bags. This initiative emphasized the importance of reusing materials, demonstrating how everyday items can be repurposed to reduce waste and promote sustainability.

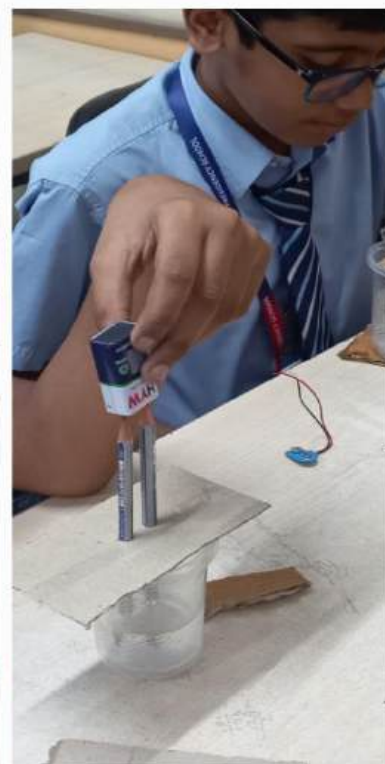




The students eagerly engaged in the process, showcasing their creativity and craftsmanship while learning valuable lessons about recycling and resourcefulness. By giving a new life to discarded clothing, they not only crafted unique, reusable bags but also contributed to a greener planet, embodying the principles of eco-friendly living

Grade 7 and 8 - Bubbles at the poles. Students learnt the concept of Electrolysis

For this activity electrolyte used was salt water, pencil leads as electrodes and a 9V C battery for power source. Students were able to identify the gases produced as hydrogen (at cathode) and oxygen (anode) based on the intensity of bubbles formed at the electrodes during the process of electrolysis.

Grade 7 - Unleash Your Inner Orator!

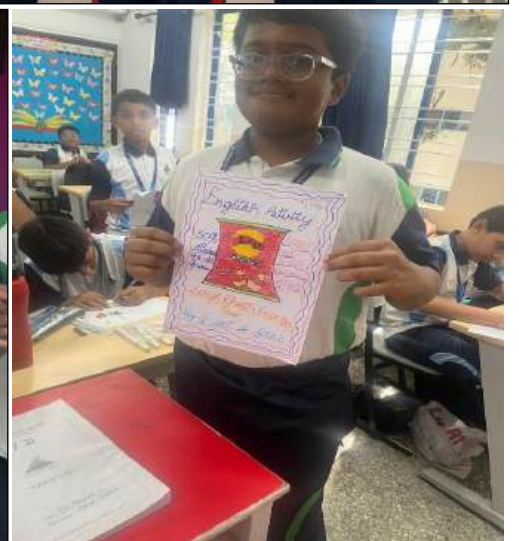

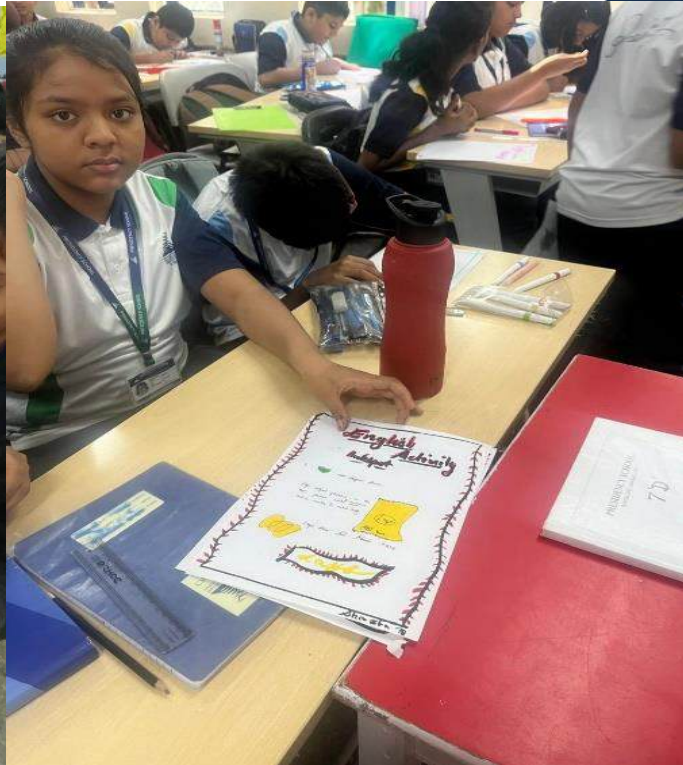
Grade 8 - Memoir- Journaling.

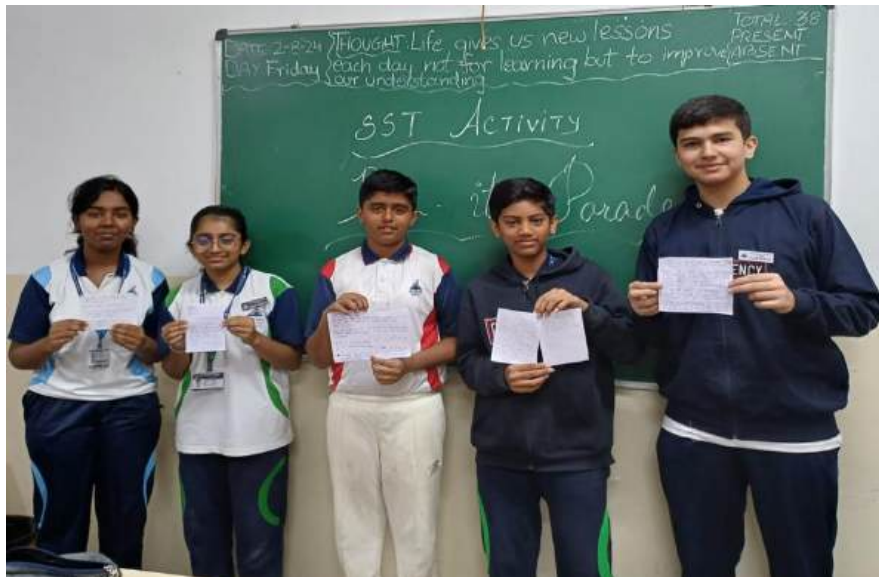


Grade 7 -Competition – Model making

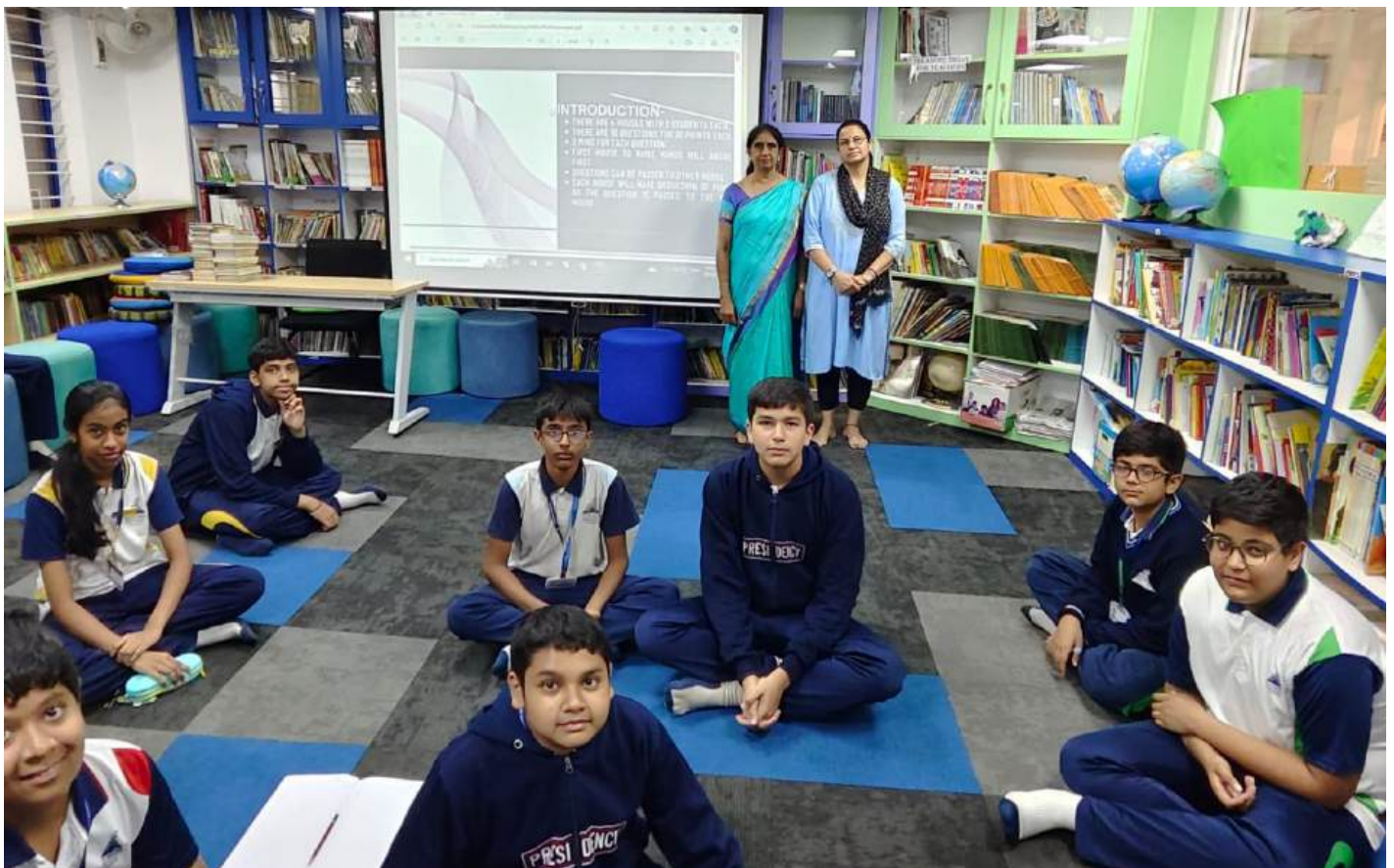
